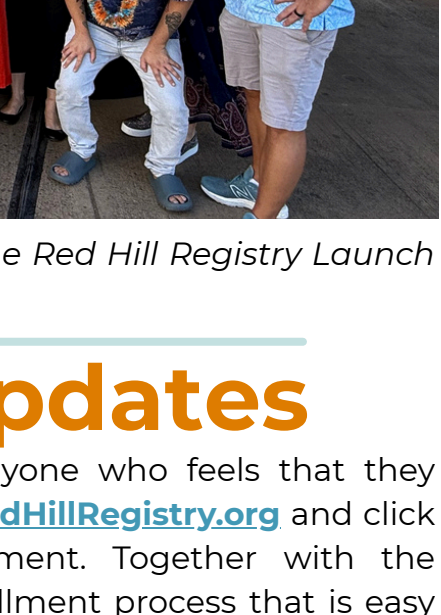

Enrollment Updates

The Red Hill Registry team encourages everyone who feels that they experienced the Red Hill water crisis to visit [RedHillRegistry.org](#) and click "Join the Registry" to complete pre-enrollment. Together with the community, our dedicated team built an enrollment process that is easy and smooth for everyone. We started our first pre-enrollment in December 2024 and are pleased to announce that full enrollment publicly launched in August 2025. Enrollment was rolled out in phases, beginning with smaller batches of emailed invitations to complete exposure and health questionnaires, scaling up to larger batches of invitations, and ultimately moving to full automation to ensure a smooth experience. This stepwise process was needed to collect the best data and provide a simplified experience for all participants. It also gave us time to check in with our participants and make sure the data was being properly recorded in our system. We are excited to reach more of our community and are currently sending invitations to larger groups! Pre-enrollment is always live on our website, and we encourage everyone who experienced the Red Hill water crisis to join.

As of October 9, 2025, 904 people have joined the registry!

Community Engagement

Community Advisory Workgroup (CAW)

The CAW is made up of seven members of the Red Hill Community who each represent different perspectives to help keep community voices at the heart of the registry. Working alongside registry staff, the CAW has provided feedback at critical stages including: questionnaire development, mission and vision statement drafting, and the selection of a Community Resource Referral Platform. This group meets about every six weeks. The most recent meeting was held on November 10, 2025, and was facilitated by Tara Sutton, the Red Hill Registry's Director of Community Engagement.
